INCIDENT - TREBES, FRANCE — FRIDAY 23rd MARCH 2018

National Counter Terrorism Policing (NCTPHQ) are aware of an incident taking place in Trebes, France.

Unconfirmed reports indicate that a firearm has been used, and that there are fatalities and injuries to people at the location.

Emergency services are responding to the incident at this time and the French government are treating the incident as terrorist related.

ACT ACTION COUNTERS TERRORISM

IN THE RARE EVENT OF a firearms or weapons attack

RUN HIDE TELL

RUN to a place of safety. This is a far better option than to surrender or negotiate. If there's nowhere to go, then...

HIDE It's better to hide than to confront. Remember to turn your phone to silent and turn off vibrate. Barricade yourself in if you can. Then finally and only when it is safe to do so...

TELL the police by calling 999.

RUN HIDE TELL



At the moment, the issue of terrorist attacks is regularly in the news. But it's been on our agenda for much longer.

The police and security service have been working constantly to foil terrorist attacks for years, not months. But we are not complacent about keeping you safe.

Due to events in the UK and abroad, people are understandably concerned about a firearms or weapons attack. These attacks are very rare but in the event of such an attack, it helps to be prepared.

Remember, attacks of this nature are still very rare in the UK.

So stay safe, and just remember the words:

RUN. HIDE. TELL.

NCTPHQ are monitoring the incident and liaising with our officers based in France and, if appropriate, further information will be provided through CSSC.

We recommend that businesses keep their protective security measures and contingency plans under review, and that your staff are familiar with their responsibilities.
