Emergency Trauma Pack[®] (ETP) Scheme

The following bulletin is communicated on behalf of Commander Gyford of the City of London Police.

The purpose of this bulletin is to raise awareness of the Emergency Trauma Pack[®] (ETP) scheme, which was launched by City of London Police subsequent to the London Bridge terror attack in 2017.

The ETP scheme falls in line with subsequent recommendations from both the Lord Harris and Lord Kerslake reviews. The aim of the scheme is to enhance preparedness. This is achieved by Police Forces working alongside businesses to augment the accessibility and availability of industry leading lifesaving medical equipment in order to best equip first responders and members of the public to deal with the early stages of a mass casualty incident.

Businesses that embed the ETP's within their premises then provide information, such as their premises address, key holder contact details and the exact location of the ETP. Having this information centrally stored and accessible, enables police control room staff to effectively coordinate the response to a mass casualty incident.

There are now over one hundred ETP's in various premises around the City of London force area, and staff at each business or location can opt in to receive enhanced training in in how to use them.

The scheme has been publicised in national media and has received endorsement by the National Counter Terrorism Police Headquarters (NCTPHQ).

Action Counters Terrorism (ACT). It is an innovative 45-minute training scheme that could help prevent terror attacks and it covers how to spot the signs of suspicious behaviour and what to do if an attack should take place. Free to use, the package can be divided into short sections to suit business needs and it takes just three quarters of an hour to complete – 45 vital minutes that could save lives.

The ACT 2018 campaign was implemented to reinforce one particular message – that communities defeat terrorism. We encourage businesses to apply for registration and make use of this free resource.
